Waste audits are the perfect tool to help students understand behaviours when it comes to our waste, while teaching what can and cannot go into their Loraas recycling blue cart. Students can use this checklist to determine what items are found within their recycling bins, then create data charts to create educational posters.

## **Recycling Reminders**

- Recyclables should be placed loosely into the cart. Make sure nothing is bagged or boxed; except shredded paper in a clear or clear colour plastic bag.
- 2. Are your recyclables clean? Make sure that food containers and bottles have been rinsed and dried before placing them into the recycling cart. Cardboard boxes, such as pizza boxes, should not have grease stains. If they do, please use your organics cart Instead.
- 3. Have the lids or caps been removed from plastic containers and bottles? Plastic bottle caps are a different plastic from the bottle and should be placed into the garbage cart.
